



In 2020, the plurality of Port Colborne's residents was in the income group of \$10,000 to \$29,999, which decreased by 8.1% since 2015. The income group of \$150,000 and over saw the largest percentage increase of 68.8% between 2015 and 2020, whereas the income group under \$10,000 experienced the largest percentage decrease (-41%; Figure 2).
