POPULATION TRENDS


According to the 2021 Census, Niagara was home to 477,941 people. From 2016-2021, Niagara's population grew by 6.7%, welcoming

30,053 new residents (see **Table 1**). Men made up 48.7% of the population, while women accounted for 51.3% in 2021 (**Figure 1**).
